October 2018

This fall we have been asking members and friends of Round Hill why the Church is important to them and what inspires them to support the Church financially. Some of their answers are included below.

We also offer information on why the Church needs your support and how you can make a first-time pledge or contribution, set up a sustaining pledge, increase your past commitment, and make a legacy pledge.

Contributions make up the single most important piece of revenue to support our mission to be a force for good in the world.

“When I arrive at RHCC on Sunday morning, I take a big deep breath, and decompress. This is *my hour* to be fully present, to God, and to the wonderful friends I have met over 20 years of being a member. I am embraced. My daughter knows she is loved, valued, and cared for. Can there be a better gift to give any child? To know they are *loved*, cared for, valued? RHCC has become a part of my personal operating budget. On a monthly basis, an automatic transfer is made from my bank to RHCC. I don't have to think about it. It happens and I make ends meet.”

That we are loved and called upon to love others suggests the kind of place most people would like to have in their lives. Round Hill is that place because of your generous financial support that enables services and programs that speak to us, enlighten and educate us, and care for us regardless of age.

Just as important, at Round Hill we learn about the needs in the community and world around us and have the opportunity to be of service to others, financially as well as through volunteer efforts.

The needs and work at our church are ongoing. Our growing congregation is committed to responding to situations where we can make a difference. It has been said that the money we give to the church is *happy money* since it comes from a place of generosity toward people who need it more than we do.

That can mean bringing a meal to someone who is going through a medical or personal crisis, volunteering to help in the Church School on a Sunday morning, cooking and serving at a local homeless shelter, or simply saying good morning and asking how you’re doing. I also know that my contribution to the church is as important as my presence.”

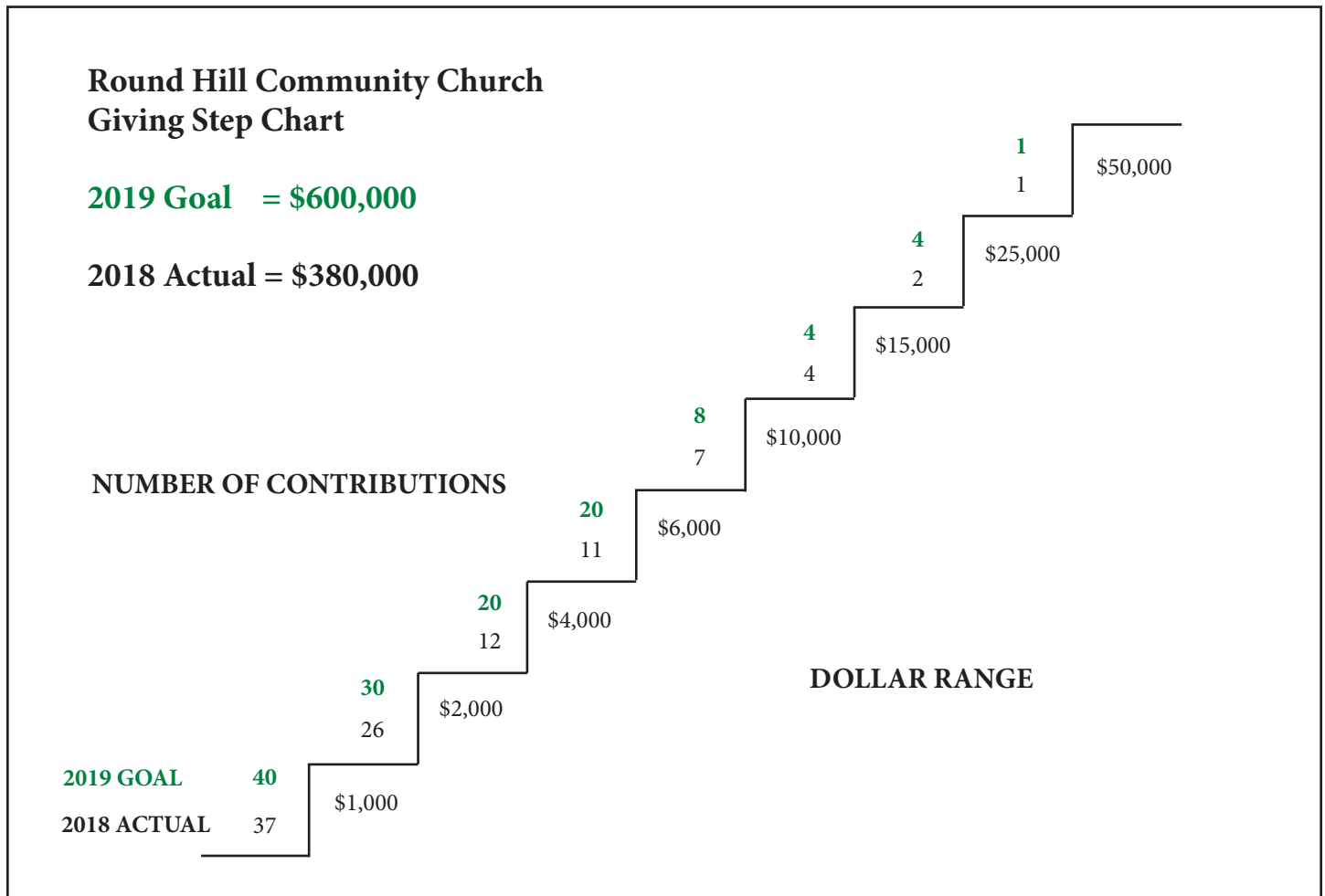

In February 2018 we held a meeting, open to the congregation, about the fiscal health of the Church. One question, echoed by others attending the forum, was a request for more specific guidance about the level of giving we need to make us fiscally healthy while maintaining our current level of excellent staffing and programming.

The chart below is a response to that question, showing the number of contributions actually given by dollar range in 2018, and also the number we need in each range (noted by the numbers in green) to reach our goal of funding 60% of our operating expenses through contributions in 2019.

By taking a step up in giving, you will be a part of making the Church fiscally healthy and committed to our mission of being a force for good in the world.

## How to Give

We have designated November 11, 2018 as Commitment Sunday, when we ask that you return your pledge card to the Church with the amount you will contribute and the method of payment. In about a week, you will receive a letter with a Pledge Card enclosed to use for that Sunday.

The reason we ask people to pledge is so that we have better information for planning for the year, but we gratefully accept contributions any time you feel prepared to give them.

In addition to using the Pledge Card for your donation, you can request giving envelopes to bring to the service for the offering plate. You can also go to the Donate page on our website and choose the amount and schedule of your contribution.

Another way to pay online is with our Church app. Go to your app store and install The Church App (it's free). Follow the instructions to make RHCC your default destination and then scroll down to "Give."

Some people choose to donate by transferring stock. If you prefer this method, please contact the Church Office for instructions.

Finally, please consider including Round Hill Community Church in your estate planning. We would be happy to meet with you to discuss and it is a wonderful way to ensure the future of the Church.

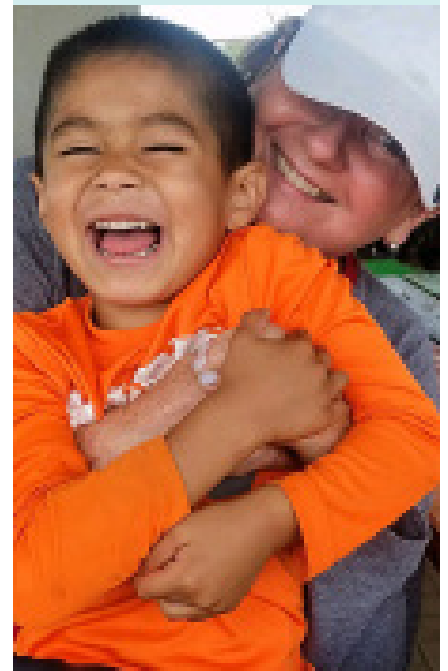
